

INSTITUTED 1806.

It having been found expedient to amend the Fundamental Laws of the Institution, and a Committee of three Proprietors (Charles Stuart Middleton, John Gordon, and John Duffield), having been appointed by Ballot, at a General Meeting, for that purpose, they submitted to the Proprietors the following Rules and Regulations, to serve, in future, as the

FUNDAMENTAL LAWS

OF THIS
INSTITUTION.

I.

THAT a General Meeting of the Proprietors shall be held on the first Wednesday of January, annually, for the purpose of electing a Committee of Thirteen: in them shall be vested the Government of the Institution for the year, naming, from themselves, a Treasurer and Secretary who shall be President and Vice. At this Meeting, shall be produced by the Treasurer for the preceding year, a State of the Affairs, a List of all Books injured, or in any way defaced, with the Names of the Persons in whose hands they were when the injury or loss took place, and a List of all Defaulters in

arrears of payment of Subscription, or Forfeits, or who may have broken any of the Fundamental Laws of this Institution.

II.

The duty of the Committee is to collect and dispose of the Subscriptions, and other Funds, in the most advantageous manner, for the use of the Library exclusively; receive and dispose of propositions for Proprietors and quarterly Subscribers; make selections of new Works and others, from those recommended by the Proprietors in a Book kept for that purpose; make and enforce such Bye Laws, Rules and Regulations, as may be necessary for the conducting the affairs of the Library with propriety and method; and manage and conduct all matters connected with the Institution. They shall meet on the first Wednesday of every month, five of their number to form a quorum; the Secretary (or in case of his absence), the Presiding Member, shall record their Proceedings in a Book kept for that purpose.

III.

The price of a Proprietor's Ticket is One Hundred Hard Dollars, payable on delivery, and an Annual Subscription of Sixteen Hard Dollars, payable half-yearly in advance. Proprietors have the privilege of introducing Strangers for three months, for whose conduct they shall be responsible, and write their names in a Book kept for that purpose.

IV.

Proprietors may sell or transfer their Tickets, on obtaining the sanction of the Committee, and their approval of the Purchaser. In cases of absence, or death, the Ticket is disposable by Transfer, Power of Attorney, or Will.

V.

Proprietors leaving the Garrison, or not making use of the Library, are not liable to pay their Subscription.

VI.

Quarterly Subscribers are admitted, at Four Dollars per Quarter, payable in advance.

VII.

Persons wishing to become Proprietors or Quarterly Subscribers, must be proposed by Proprietors, on a written Public Notice in the Rooms, eight days previous to a Meeting of the Committee, when they will be balloted for, and admitted by a majority of, at least, two-thirds of the Members present; and, if rejected, cannot be proposed again for Six Months.

VIII.

Proprietors only have the privilege of recommending new or other Works for the Library, which is to be done by writing the Title in a Book kept for that purpose, with any corresponding remark. From this Book, the Committee will make a selection, at least, every three months, according to the state of the Funds.

IX.

The Committee will decide what Works are to be considered Books of Reference, which shall be marked in the Catalogue as such, and are not to be taken out of the Rooms without the sanction of the Treasurer.

X.

The number of Books deliverable at one time, to be one Folio, one Quarto, two Octavo's, three smaller, and the whole Set of a Novel, which cannot be transferred from one Member to another, without first being returned to the Librarian. The time allowed for keeping them is, for Folio's, Quarto's, and two Octavo's, two Weeks; for smaller and Novels, one Week: Forfeits for exceeding this time to be named by the Committee, and other Books denied until paid.

XI.

Whoever applies to the Librarian, first, for a Book, to have it, and others, in the order of their application.

XII.

Any Book, lost or defaced, the Person in whose hands it was, or ought to have been, shall pay double the value of the Book (so lost or defaced), under penalty of being excluded the Institution, subject, however, to mitigation by the Committee.

XIII.

Any Proprietor wishing to call a General Meeting for a special purpose, will give notice to the Secretary, stating the subject to be treated upon, signed by Six Proprietors, when Public Notice will be given for two Weeks previous.

XIV.

Proprietors (if any), keeping Hotels or Lodging-houses, shall not be allowed to introduce Strangers.

XV.

No Pamphlet or Periodical Work, can be taken out of the Library, until Fourteen days after arrival—Newspapers received by Packets, to remain on the Table until the arrival of a succeeding Packet, when they shall be filed—Newspapers received by the Inland Post, to remain One Week on the Table, and are not to be removed out of the Reading Room, under any pretence whatever.

XVI.

The Rooms to be Open in Summer, from Eight, and in Winter, from Nine o'clock in the Morning, until second Gun-fire in the Evening, and on Sundays, from Nine to half-past Ten Forenoon, and from One to Three in the Afternoon.

XVII.

No Fundamental Law shall be suspended, repealed, or amended,

or any New One carried into force, without being approved by the majority of a General Meeting, summoned by the Committee for the Special purpose, the Question being made public in the Rooms Eight Days previous to the day of Meeting.

At a General Meeting of the Proprietors of the GIBRALTAR COMMERCIAL LIBRARY, held the 12th day of June, 1822, the foregoing were discussed, Article by Article, and finally adopted, as the Fundamental Laws of the Institution.


